1.0 Call to Order

2.0 Routine Matters

.1 Approval of Agenda

.2 FY 2024 Transportation Planning Work Program (TPWP)

Rump summarized the purpose of the plan and reviewed the planning budget for the upcoming fiscal year.

.3 Draft Public Participation Plan (PPP)

Rump reviewed the draft PPP and indicated that there were no comments during the 45-day public review/comment period. The committee will be asked to consider approval at the June meeting.

.4 Review Policy Committee Bylaws

Rump indicated that the bylaws haven't been reviewed in a number of years and contain references to outdate legislation. As requested by the committee, the bylaw changes have been reviewed by the TTAC. The TTAC had no comments. The committee will be asked to consider approval at the June meeting.

.6 FY 2023-2026 TIP Amendments

- City of Oxford Center St Bridge over Hurtzel Run to receive City Bridge Funds of \$1,500,000;
- City of Springville 5th Ave Bridge over Little Big Creek to receive City Bridge Funds of \$1,500,000;
- City of Wellman 9th Ave Bridge over Smith Creek moved to FY 2024:
- City of Vinton E. 13th St Bridge over Mudd Creek to receive City Bridge Funds of \$1,500,000
- Pavement Management Data Collection opt in of \$174,831for FY 2023.

4.0 Old Business

.1 TAP Update

Iowa DOT has still not given RPAs and MPOs authorization to solicit new TAP applications. Since it will be impossible to solicit and approve new applications before the TIP is due in July, new TAP applications won't be accepted for this cycle. The current plan is to open the next TAP application cycle in September.

.2 Active Transportation Plan (ATP) Update

The ATP update is underway. A Talk to ECICOG site has been deployed to allow for public input. A survey, mapping exercise and opportunity to share ideas are all available

on the Talk to ECICOG site. Open houses are being planned in County in June. Staff are conferring with RTAC members to finalize dates and locations.

.3 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

The second round of SS4A funding is underway. Applications are being accepted until July 10, 2023. Rump intends to apply for funding to complete a Safety Action Plan for all cities in the RPA (excluding metropolitan cities). The secondary roads within the RPA will be covered by a SS4A grant that was awarded during the first round of funding.
