### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Zirkelbach at 1:32 p.m.

M/S/C (Lumsden/Fish) to approve the agenda as presented. All ayes.

### 2. APPROVE MINUTES

### a. Board Meeting Minutes – August 25, 2022

M/S/C (Sullivan/Gage) to approve the minutes of the August 25, 2022 board meeting as presented. All ayes.

#### 3. FINANCIAL REPORT

### a. Receive and File Financial Statements for Audit

Rump stated the information was in the packet and would forward any questions to Karen Kurt if she couldn't answer them.

M/S/C (Yoder/Van Steenhuyse) to receive and file the August financial statements for audit. All ayes.

### b. Approve Expenditures

Lumsden asked about payments for the statewide hazard mitigation plans. Peters explained ECICOG has a contract with the state for the statewide hazard mitigation plan and we pass through funds to other COGs as their work on the plan is completed. He also asked about the payment to Hometown Pride because he thought ECICOG would be receiving funds for this program. Peters said ECICOG will receive a monthly allocation from Keep Iowa Beautiful but did not have details of the contract. Rump said she would ask Karen Kurt to send out clarification to the Board regarding the Keep Iowa Beautiful Hometown Pride payment.

M/S/C (Lumsden/Yoder) to approve the expenditures for September. All ayes.

### 4. REPORTS

### a. Director's Report

Rump gave an update on the transportation program delay. She said as the RPA, we receive an allocation of Iowa's Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) and Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) funds for local programming. Because these are federal funds, the regional process must follow all Iowa and federal transportation requirements. With each new federal transportation authorization, the IDOT completes a statewide funding distribution discussion and a review with the Federal Highway Administration. With the adoption of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act in November 2021, the compliance review has taken longer than usual and the methods to determine compliance with the required competitive selection process must still be resolved. The IDOT has asked RPAs not to undertake regional TAP application submittals at this time. To avoid confusion, both STBG and TAP application processes are being delayed until IDOT confirms that issues surrounding the TAP program are resolved. The initial assessment was that the delay will be about a month. In a recent meeting with Iowa DOT, they mentioned that the delay would be longer - about three to four months.

### b. Community and Economic Development Report - none

### c. Housing Report

Achenbach gave an update on current projects and nuisance enforcement. She said Deanna Robinson is the new Planner/Housing Specialist in the housing department and she will be filling in for Nicole Beuc for the PATCH program while she is on maternity leave starting in the middle of October. She gave an update on CDBG DR applications for Benton and Iowa Counties and anticipated the applications will be released by IEDA in early October. Lumsden asked how much more workload Culver can handle with the nuisance enforcement before he will need assistance. Achenbach said they will have to determine the amount of workload over the next few months to see if hiring another person is feasible. Discussion followed.

### d. Transportation and Transit Report

Rump gave an update on the Safe Streets for All and EV charging stations programs. She said Iowa will receive approximately \$7.6 million in the first year for EV charging stations. More details will be shared when she receives information from the IDOT. Discussion followed. Lumsden asked about the Johnson County employment transportation trial. Rump said the Johnson County Mobility Coordinator will come to a future board meeting and provide a summary of the program.

### e. Environmental Services Report

Presto said they have been working on completing the watershed projects and the solid waste comprehensive plan is being updated.

Yoder said Washington County is moving towards having all their county offices located in one building.



We still have one final draw on our EDA CARES Act planning grant yet to be processed; all of the associated expenses have been paid.

### **Executive Director's Report – October 2022**

<u>USDA Office Visit</u> On October 12, a few staff members visited the regional USDA office in Tipton to receive updates on their programs. It was good timing as both of our organizations have a number of new staff members. While ECICOG doesn't typically work directly with homeowners or homebuyers outside of our CDBG programs, USDA does offer excellent low interest programs in rural areas for low to moderate income individuals: <u>Single Family Housing Programs | Rural Development (usda.gov)</u>. Several communities in our region as also qualify for their community facilities loans/grants: <u>Community Facilities Programs | Rural Development (usda.gov)</u>. or water programs (which can be combined with CDBG funding) Water & Environmental Programs | Rural Development (usda.gov).

<u>Entrepreneur Support</u> IEDA announced that \$96 million dollars in ARPA funding available through the Department of Treasury would go to the following activities:

- Loan sharing program for investments in Manufacturing 4.0: \$28 million to help lowa manufacturers invest in the new technologies that are transforming the industry. The state will buy part of the loan to offset the risk for lenders.
- Small Business Collateral Support Program: \$15 million to help small businesses make up for a lack of collateral when they secure credit through commercial lenders. Eligible borrowers include small businesses that are 51% owned by women, people from all backgrounds, veterans, people with disabilities and longtime rural residents; and small businesses that support arts and culture in lowa.
- **Venture Capital Innovation Fund Program:** \$22 million to improve funding opportunities in government entrepreneurship programs. This fund will also provide more funding to fill gaps in the development stages of startups as companies work on concept, launch and expansion.
- **Venture Capital Co-Investment Fund Program:** \$31 million to process and hold holdings in private companies and ensure investments qualify

These new programs could have an impact on business interest in our revolving loan program, especially given that our interest rates now mirror market rates. Applications for the IEDA programs are under development.

Comprehensive Planning ECICOG is beginning the comprehensive planning process for Swisher and will soon start planning processes for Oxford and Anamosa. While this means we will be very busy in Community Development team, we are very excited to do this work as it provides us with a great deal of insight into the communities we serve. During the next year we are going to be focusing on systematizing our planning processes so that we can be very efficient yet provide a customized plan that reflects each community's unique aspirations.

<u>Employee Benefits</u> Last January, the Personnel Committee recommended that we potentially exploring joining a county benefit plan. Johnson County was specifically mentioned as they already have other entities covered through the county. After further exploration, we learned that this is no longer an option for Johnson County with their current insurance carrier. As a result, ECICOG will continue to worker with a benefit advisor to secure coverage.

<u>Director Retreat</u> I attended the ICOG Director retreat on October 20. We had great sessions on branding and employee recruitment/retention. I facilitated a group "pecha kucha" style presentation where each COG shared five ideas that their peers might be able to use.

<u>Audit</u> Larry Pump and his team visited the office last week to conduct our annual audit. The Board receives the audit report at the December meeting.

<u>November/December Meeting</u> Weather permitting, we are hoping to do our combined November/December meeting (held on Thursday, December 1) in Washington. Board members would have an opportunity to tour the newly remodeled MiniBus facility.

<u>Staffing Updates</u> Planning Fellow Harrison Freund left us on October 14 as his two-year fellowship ended. Based on our projected workload and some available transportation planning funds, we are recruiting for new fellow (12-18 months). The first six months of the fellowship would be focused on creating a regional trail plan. Housing Recovery Specialist Nicole Beuc gave birth to Cooper Lee on Friday, October 14. Both mother and baby are doing well. Housing Planner Deanna Robinson will oversee the PATCH program during Nicole's absence.

- Applicants must provide a minimum of 4, NEVI-compliant charging stations per site.
- Level 3 charging stations are required Level 3 chargers deliver between 50 kW and 350 kW power. They will fill a battery at a rate of 7,500-1,200 miles per hour and top off an empty battery in 30 minutes.
- Applicants must also be able to provide a number of on-site amenities including, 24/7 access, restroom facilities, lodging, convenient stores, shopping. Sites with more amenities will score higher in the application review process.
